Hebrew College's 2023-2024 Application for Financial Aid - Instructions

Hebrew College's Office of Financial Aid is eager to help as you develop plans to pay for and/or finance your educational and living expenses. Should you have any questions about your financial aid options, the application process, or the status of your application, please call the number indicated above or send an email to financialaid@hebrewcollege.edu. Confidentiality: All financial aid information supplied by you is considered confidential and will not be made available to any individual or entity not directly connected with granting financial aid at Hebrew College.

Eligibility: Financial aid is available to matriculated students in degree and/or ordination programs only. Aid may be awarded to newly accepted candidates in most of Hebrew College's degree programs, and to continuing degree candidates in good academic standing. **Students must re-apply for aid each academic year.** Aid may be awarded by the College in the form of multi-year Fellowships, merit and need-based Scholarships, and Need-based Grants. Financial aid awarded by the College will be applied towards your tuition costs only. Federal loans, if you qualify, may be used towards tuition, registration fees and other costs (e.g., living expenses).

To qualify for financial aid, you must:

- Be accepted to one of Hebrew College's degree and/or ordination programs
- Enroll at least ½ time in both the fall and spring semesters, and/or optional summer term (If you are in your final year of enrollment before completing your degree program and you enroll less than ½ time, you may still qualify for federal aid please speak to the Financial Aid Office. If you intend to take a Leave of Absence, please inform the Financial Aid Office and Registrar.)
- Be in good academic standing within your program of study
- Have no outstanding tuition and fees owed to Hebrew College from the current or previous semesters
- Meet federal guidelines to receive federal aid

FAFSA: Applicants and continuing students are asked to complete a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). (Continuing students receiving a multi-year Fellowship are asked to complete a FAFSA only if they will be requesting federal Direct Student Loans.) For more information and to complete the FAFSA application form, go to www.fafsa.ed.gov. Hebrew College's FAFSA code is 002157.

Information needed for this year's FAFSA is based on your 2021 federal income taxes, which would have been filed on or about April 15, 2022. A summary FAFSA report, based on the information you have provided, will automatically be sent to you and to the College. Please note that we will not process your FAFSA until after we receive your Hebrew College "Application for Financial Aid," **and** you are accepted into one of our degree programs.

Current vs. Prior-Prior Year: While this year's FAFSA should be completed based on your 2021 income, assets, and family circumstances ("prior-prior year"), Hebrew College's accompanying "2023-2024 Application for Financial Aid" should be completed based on your current income, assets, and family circumstances. Hebrew College is keenly aware that your current financial circumstances may be very different from what you were experiencing in 2021. If this is the case, we ask that you attach a statement outlining the changes that have occurred (e.g., "My spouse ended their employment on 5/1/22 in anticipation of the birth of our first child").

Applicants for Admission: If you are an applicant for admission to one of Hebrew College's degree programs, you are encouraged but not required to submit the accompanying "Application for Financial Aid," and your FAFSA, at the same time that you apply for admission. Both this form and the FAFSA may be completed and submitted as early as October 1, 2022. The sooner we receive your financial aid paperwork, the sooner you will receive your financial aid notification. Applicants to Hebrew College's ordination programs are required to submit their "Application for Financial Aid" and their FAFSA by February 1, 2023. If you are accepted and you defer your enrollment, a new financial aid application will be required by March 1st prior to the planned start of your program.

Continuing Matriculated students: If you are a continuing Hebrew College student, you must reapply for financial aid each year. A completed Hebrew College "Application for Financial Aid" and your FAFSA report are due by April 1st each year. Financial aid applications received after this deadline will be considered, but the amount of institutional aid available may be limited.

- ♦ Applicants who are U.S. citizens or eligible non-citizens: You MUST complete the online Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). *Non-US Citizens see below.*
- ♦ Federal Income Taxes must be completed and filed: The Tax information on which the 2023-2024 FAFSA application is based was due to be filed by April 15, 2022—this is your tax return for the 2021 fiscal year. Please note that if your FAFSA application is selected for verification, you will be required to submit an official IRS tax transcript during the verification process. No aid can be disbursed until the verification process is completed.
- ♦ For Those Not Required to File Federal Income Taxes: If you are a non-tax filer, we ask that you submit a signed statement indicating that you have not filed and that you are not required to file federal income taxes. You must also provide W-2 or 1099 forms to verify your income for the year.
- ♦ Foreign students/Non-US citizens must supply income information. A foreign student is a non-eligible non-citizen if they are or will be in the U.S. on a visa, including the F-1 Student Visa issued through the school. You are still required to supply income information even if your income is from a country other than the U.S. All information must be supplied in writing and in English showing U.S. Dollar amounts. As a non-eligible foreign student, you are not eligible to complete the FAFSA.
- ♦ Foreign students must supply Visa information. If you are in the U.S. on a visa other than an F-1 Student Visa received through Hebrew College, you must provide a copy of your current passport and visa.
- ♦ If there is any other relevant information that would help us to understand your needs, please attach a typed statement to the application explaining any other considerations we should be taking into account.

COMPLETE PAGE 1 of this application if you are only applying for fellowships, scholarships and merit awards, and do not wish to be considered for need-based aid. Be sure to SIGN PAGE 2 of this application.

COMPLETE BOTH PAGE 1 and PAGE 2 of this application if you wish to be considered for need-based aid as well as fellowships, scholarships and merit awards. Be sure to SIGN PAGE 2 of the application.
