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Spring Course Registration Open

Add some Jewish learning to your life this spring! Peruse our <u>course listings</u> and register for a spring semester course. Hebrew College is offering some exciting new courses and new tuition options. Courses are available in Jewish Education, Jewish Studies, Jewish Music, and in our Rabbinical School, for credit or not-for-credit, online or on campus.

Community Education Courses

For community members who are not currently pursuing degrees at Hebrew College, a few select online courses are being offered for a special rate of \$500, plus a \$55 registration fee (if taken as non-credit courses, also known as "auditing".) There include:

- History and Memory: Medieval & Modern Periods, with Professor Barry Mesch, offered through the <u>Department of Jewish Studies</u>
- Music of the Jewish People, with Adjunct Instructor Judy Pinnolis, offered through the <u>School of Jewish Music</u>.

Hebrew Language

On-campus and online <u>Hebrew language</u> classes continue to be available for beginning through advanced Hebrew students.

- Ulpan: Modern Hebrew: An on-campus language immersion program, Ulpan offers classes on weekday mornings, evenings, and Sunday afternoons. Designed for individuals interested in learning conversational Hebrew through the lens of Israeli culture, the Ulpan program uses the linguistic-immersion method developed and popularized in Israel. Ulpan is a full-language program that teaches grammar, reading comprehension and conversation skills.
- Modern Hebrew Online: New interactive curricula utilize learning materials in written, audio, and video formats. The program focuses on everyday language relating to personal introductions, food and eating, transportation, and even some Hebrew slang. Students also learn about Israeli culture by listening to popular Israeli music, viewing segments of Israeli television programs and documentary clips, and learning about Israeli currency.



Lighting Up the Darkness One Good Point at a Time Parashat Vayeishev (Genesis 37:1-40:23)

As someone who, by nature of my profession, has the privilege of leading my congregation in prayer on a regular basis, I have long taken inspiration and instruction from a quote from the Hasidic master Rebbe Nachman of Breslov (1772-1810), who said in his teaching "*Azamra*":

...The one who can create these melodies by finding the good points in every Jew... is fit to be the prayer leader. The leader of the communal prayers must represent the whole congregation. He [or she] must find and gather all the good points in each of the worshippers. All these good points must be joined



together in him so that when he stands before God in prayer he comes with the power of all this good.

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
