Panoramic view from the Saadian Dynasty fortress, stroll around Fes, visit the Royal Palace and the Mellah—the famous Jewish quarter and cemetery—the Ibn Danan Synagogue, Maimonides house, and the 700-year-old Madrasa Bou Inania, one of the few Muslim shrines open to non-Muslims

Visit the famous Casbah in Mechnes

Magnificent twilight view of Fes from the Borj Sud fortress

From Fes to the Sahara

Breakfast at hotel

Depart Fes to the famous alpine town of Ifrane in the Mid-Atlas region at an altitude of 5000 ft.

Visit Al Akhawayn University and meet leaders of the “Mamounah student group”

Continue along the spectacular gorges of the Ziz River to the Tafilalet Oasis, once the center of an independent kingdom that sent caravans throughout Africa

Visit a Berber museum and the tomb of Rabbi Shmuel Abuchazira, one of the most famous of Morocco’s Jewish sages

Continue to Erfoud, the gateway to the Sahara

Overnight | Kasbah Hotel Chergui, Erfoud

The Route of a Thousand Kasbahs

Sunrise jeep ride to the Merzouga

Dunes in the heart of the Sahara Desert

Storytelling & Drumming Circle—Learn traditional Berber tales around a campfire, accompanied by drumming and local instruments.

Return for a leisurely breakfast at our hotel and check out

Depart Erfoud via the incredible Todgha Canyon along the “Route of 1000 Kasbahs” to the desert city of Quarzazate, which has provided the scenery for innumerable Hollywood westerns

The High Atlas Mountains

Check out and depart Quarzazate for Marrakesh, crossing the breathtaking vistas of the High Atlas mountain range. Stop along the way to visit the remnants of a Jewish Berber village, to visit synagogues and shrines left behind by the Jewish community before it departed for Israel

Meet with Yosef Ben Meir, president of the High Atlas organization, dedicated to preserving the heritage of the Jewish community in the Atlas Mountains*

Continue to Marrakesh for dinner at its kosher restaurant

Visit the Berber Museum in the Majorelle Gardens, which took 40 years to create
