


Hebrew College Teen Beit Midrash Students







SUPPORTING YOUR PASSIONS

Beryl and David z”l Hoffman’s shared love of learning began long before they discovered Hebrew College. When they married in 1988, they included a commitment to learning in the text of their ketubah. Decades later they found their way to Hebrew College’s Adult Learning programs, where the Hoffmans became devoted students and enthusiastic ambassadors. What began as curiosity grew into meaningful relationships with teachers and fellow learners, and an expansive exploration of Jewish culture and ideas.

They introduced friends to the courses and found themselves returning again and again to the material long after the classes ended. Beryl, who grew up in a secular but strongly Jewish home, found that the classes kept opening new layers of meaning. David, whose Orthodox upbringing and years in yeshiva had shaped his intellectual instincts in his professional life as a consultant, relished the rigor and richness of the teaching. The courses spoke to both of them, bridging backgrounds in a shared search for understanding.

As David’s health declined, the couple discussed wanting to establish a legacy rooted in the values that shaped their marriage. Supporting Tamid Adult Learning at Hebrew College with a gift in David’s honor reflects their belief that Jewish learning should be accessible, relevant, and transformative for adults at every stage of life.

“It wasn’t surface knowledge learning. It wasn’t just facts, it was deeper,” says Beryl, who also emphasizes the immediacy of the learning. “It connected in so many ways for us; relevance, that was so important to David and me.”

JEWISH EDUCATION



The **Beker Foundation** provided a grant for operating funds to support the work of the Betty Ann Greenbaum Miller Center for Interreligious Learning & Leadership.

E. Rhodes and Leona B. Carpenter Foundation

The **E. Rhodes and Leona B. Carpenter Foundation** provided a grant to support a seminar on Interreligious Literacy and Leadership for Jewish Seminararians.

The guide is intended to help promote interfaith dialogue.



Hebrew College received a grant from the **Israel Institute** to develop and deliver a course, "But Where is the Sheep...": Responding to Trauma in Modern Israeli Literature. It was offered as an elective to the Rabbinical students and was open to adult education students for auditing in the Spring semester. It highlighted the struggle with the Land and Jewish tradition in modern Hebrew Literature.



The **Legacy Heritage Fund** provided a grant to support Hebrew College's Bonim B'Yachad fellowship program. Bonim B'Yachad is an online, 10-month national cohort-based fellowship to help adults new to teaching in part-time and supplemental Jewish educational settings. The fellowship provides professional development in pedagogy, Jewish content knowledge, and classroom management for new teachers. In addition, fellows attend a three-day subsidized in-person Fall retreat at Hebrew College.



The **Henry Luce Foundation** awarded a grant to the Hebrew College Betty Ann Greenbaum Miller Center for Interreligious Learning & Leadership to support "Panim el Panim" (Face to Face), "American Jewish Leaders Engaging Across Difference", to better understand each other across their differences and engage in honest, humble discussion about Israeli society, culture, and history, and the relationship between Israel and the American Jewish community.



The **Midcareer Fellowship** program continued to provide generous tuition subsidies to experienced Jewish professionals to earn a master's degree in Jewish education.


